FIRST LETTER TO THE CORINTHIANS

Resurrection of the death

15 ³In the first place, I have passed on to you what I myself received: that Christ died for our sins, as Scripture says; ⁴that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day, according to the Scriptures; ⁵that he appeared to Cephas and then to the Twelve. ⁶Afterwards he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters together; most of them are still alive, although some have already gone to rest. ⁷Then he appeared to James and after that to all the apostles. ⁸And last of all, he appeared to the most despicable of them, this is to me. ¹¹Now, whether it was I or they, this we preach and this you have believed.

¹³If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised. ¹⁴And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is empty and our belief comes to nothing.

²⁰But no, Christ has been raised from the dead and he comes before all those who have fallen asleep. ²¹A human being brought death; a human being also brings resurrection of the dead. ²²All die for being Adam's, and in Christ all will receive life.
